

ON FOOT IN THE SHALDON AREA

CHILDREN'S PLAY PARK –right by the sea wall –enclosed swings, slides, climbing frames, rocking horse- plus tables and chairs for picnics

SHALDON WILDLIFE ZOO - situated above the Ness headland, a small compact Zoo which is perfect for adults and children alike, with all sorts of activities, particularly aimed at conservation.

SHALDON APPROACH GOLF – up on the Ness Cliffs-one of the best approach golf courses in the S West. –with breathtaking views of the Teign Estuary and Teignmouth.You can hire clubs there, and requires no specific clothes or golf shoes

SHALDON BOWLING CLUB-welcomes visitors

SHALDON BOTANICAL GARDENS –An historically important local garden set in the hillside of Shaldon.

Homeyards Botanical Gardens are situated on a sloping hillside above Shaldon and enjoy views of Teignmouth across the river and the East Devon and Dorset coastline to the north east. Features such as the castle, pond and rill garden, and the Italianate Garden make the Gardens an interesting place to explore

NESS BEACH

Accessed via an original Smugglers tunnel, Ness Cove is one our most secluded and picturesque beaches.

Mainly shingle, the beach graduates gently towards the sea. Why not try fishing for shrimps in the glistening rock pools, or try a spot of fishing from the beach. Or alternately just sit and watch the rest of the world go by

You can book the beach for evening barbeques.

SHALDON RIVER BEACHES – a long stretch of safe beach with it's distinctive dark sand. Bordered by cottages, cafes and a pubs, you can spend all day-watching sailing, fishing and boating

SEASONAL FUN- there is a week with the Shaldon Regatta, plus a

water carnival and various fetes and a classical Music Festival –all of which take place every year.

NEXT DOOR –at Ringmore House –homemade cream teas and cakes, and dining. Pre booking only.

CAFES –there are at least four in the village itself

RESTAURANTS – There are numerous Restaurants and Bars all within walking distance

PUBS-We boast 3 good pubs in the village –all provide lunches and dinners

WALKING – Shaldon and the cliffs are part of the South Coast Path, however, you can walk upstream from just outside our properties –at low water you can reach Coombe Cellars which is located on the water's edge

ACTIVITIES – there are classical concerts in the village, usually held in St Peter's Church. Theatre productions, and Art exhibitions in the village hall

Cookery courses, Sailing and Knitting courses plus Various Keep fit and Rowing clubs

SHOPPING –Shaldon has a full range of shops within easy walking distance- a Bakery, Butcher with deli and fruit & veg, a Chemist, a Post Office, a Newsagent and a Londis store with most provisions. In addition there are several gift shops and a Ladies clothing shop.

TEIGNMOUTH –across the Estuary by either the road bridge-or for a fun day out, take the ancient foot ferry from Shaldon beach –that runs almost all year round
